Alcohol item pick up

For any Liquor/Alcohol purchased from our Galleria Gift Shops, please collect these from 09:00pm-11:30pm at the Galleria Shops, Deck 7, Aft on the final evening of your cruise.

Any alcohol that was purchased ashore and held at the gangway, please collect personally on the morning of disembarkation between 6:30am - 9:30am, in the Atrium, Deck 5, Mid - Starboard Side.

Wheelchair assistance

Guests requiring wheelchair assistance into the terminal are kindly asked to meet in Dazzles Nightclub, Deck 6, Mid, 15 minutes prior to their disembarkation time. **Unfortunately, this assistance cannot be provided during the Easy Walk-off program due to USCBP.**

Settling your account

6:00am-9:00am, Atrium, Deck 5, Mid

An itemized statement of your On-Board Credit Account will be delivered to your stateroom after 5:00am, on disembarkation morning. To settle your account with cash or travellers checks, or if you have any discrepancies with your statement, please proceed to the On-board Credit Desk in the Atrium before you disembark the vessel. If you have made arrangements to settle your account with a credit card and your statement is at zero balance, your charges will automatically be billed to your credit card so there is no need to come to the Desk. All accounts must be settled onboard before disembarking. All cash transactions will cease at 12:00 midnight of the last evening until 6:00 am.

Debarck Morning:

Cash Accounts: If you do wish to make a further purchase please stop by the On-Board Credit Desk to settle your accounts prior to debarkation.

What is the Service Charge?

A \$12 USD discretionary service charge has been automatically added per guest per day (for guests three years and older) to your shipboard account for all staterooms. This charge will be shared among those staff members, including the restaurant staff, stateroom stewards and other behind-the-scenes staff who have provided services to enhance your overall cruise experience.

However, certain staff positions (e.g., beverage service, concierge, butler and youth counsellors) do not benefit from this shared service charge because they provided service to only some guests, not all. If you have received excellent service from any of these staff members, we encourage you to acknowledge them with appropriate gratuities.

Mini Bar

We will take a final inventory and lock the Mini Bar on the last evening of your cruise. Please let your Stateroom Steward know if you need to keep the Mini Bar un-locked. Beverages can be ordered from Room Service by dialing 27.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection Inspection US CBP

All guests MUST proceed through U.S. Customs and Border Protection inspection in Miami.

Important: Please have your SKY guest key card, proof of citizenship and completed customs declaration form in hand when you proceed to the gangway.

Filling out your U.S. Customs Form

All Heads of households, regardless of nationality, must complete one U.S. Customs Declaration Form to include those family members traveling with you and residing at the same address.

All guests are required to have a completed customs declaration form in hand even if they have nothing to declare.

You must declare the total value of all articles acquired abroad that you are bringing into the United States, including those items purchased on the ship. All tax-free items (i.e. artwork, unset precious gemstones, perfume, cosmetics, antiques and U.S. made products), must be listed on the back of the Customs declaration form.

- Guests who purchase artwork and do not take the purchase off the vessel (item shipped home) – items do not need to be declared.
- Guests who purchase artwork and take the purchase off with them – although duty-free, items must still be declared (no duty will be assessed).
- Guests who purchase loose gems onboard (or shore side) – although duty-free, items must still be declared (no duty assessed).

Undeclared merchandise is subject to seizure and/or penalty. If you have exceeded your Customs exemption, you must list all purchases on the back of the Customs form and the head of the household must present themselves with receipts to USCBP in the terminal in Miami.

Your Customs exemption includes:

- Purchases up to \$800 per person
- 1 carton of 200 cigarettes – must be 21 years or older. Excess U.S. Cigarettes marked with "U.S. tax-exempt for use outside U.S." or "made for export only" will be seized. Foreign manufactured tobacco products will be subject to duty and internal revenue taxes. Please note that any cigarettes over the allowance will be confiscated by the U.S.C.B.P.
- 100 Cigars (No Cuban cigars allowed) – must be 21 years or older
- 1 liter of alcohol – must be 21 years or older. Applicable internal revenue taxes and duties will be assessed on alcohol overages.

Prohibited Items: Fruits, nuts, plants, soil, flowers, drugs, narcotics, indecent materials, Cuban cigars, African ivory, Snake skin, Turtle shell products, guns or weapons.

Special Note: As per U.S. Customs and Border Protection Officials, strictly no photography or videotaping is allowed in the terminal. The use of cellular phones is also prohibited.

US Department of Agriculture Regulation

Please deposit all fruits, vegetables, meat products, plants, seeds and soil at the gangway in a disposal bin. Failure to comply with the US Department of Agriculture regulation can result in an immediate fine of \$500.00.
