GENERAL EMERGENCY DRILL

It is a requirement of law that all guests are exercised in the ship's general emergency procedures within 24 hours of joining the ship. This drill will take place at 4.15pm today. Prior to attending this drill we would like to bring your attention to the safety notice on or near the back of your door and ask that you view the safety film which is showing continuously on stateroom TV channel 22.

STATEROOM SAFETY NOTICE

As your safety is our prime concern, we would like to remind you of some important precautions you must take while in your stateroom or on your balcony.

- Never use lighted candles, naked flames or any other burning material either in your stateroom or on your balcony.
- If you smoke, please use the ashtrays provided for your stateroom or balcony and ensure your cigarette is fully extinguished.
- Please do not smoke in bed or throw any cigars or cigarettes over the ship's side.
- Heated electrical items (such as a curling iron) used in your stateroom should not be left plugged in and unattended. When finished with the item, please ensure it is unplugged immediately.
- The use of irons and non-thermostatically controlled water heaters is strictly prohibited.
- Do not hang clothing out or leave personal items unattended on the balcony.
- Before retiring for the evening please bring all personal items inside.
- Do not place any items on top of the light fittings.

FORMAL: Black tie or formal dark suit for gentlemen; evening dress or other formal attire for ladies

SEMI FORMAL DRESS: Jacket and tie for gentlemen; cocktail dress or trouser suit for the ladies. No jeans.

ELEGANT CASUAL: Jacket, no tie required for gentlemen; dress, skirt or trousers for ladies, no shorts or jeans.

SHIPBOARD INFORMATION

THE MOST FAMOUS OCEAN LINERS IN THE WORLD

CUNARD SOFT DRINK PACKAGE

The Cunard soft drinks package, allows you to enjoy unlimited fountain sodas and selected juices for the entire voyage for a one-time payment (in-transit guests will be required to purchase again for the next leg of the voyage). The package can only be bought on the first and second day of the voyage and must be purchased for the full duration of the voyage. To enjoy this facility, take your ship's identity card to any of the cocktail bars on board where the staff will be delighted to assist you. The package entitles the bearer of the card only, to unlimited fountain sodas and selected juices served by the glass in any of the restaurants and cocktail bars. The price per day is \$4.95 per person with a 15% service charge. This package does not extend to bottled waters, in-cabin beverage service or to any other non-alcoholic cocktails / beverages.

SECURITY PRECAUTIONS

In order to prevent unauthorised persons boarding the ship, you are required to carry your 'Ship's Identity Card' with you when going ashore. You will be asked to produce this at the gangway when you leave and return to the ship. Please ensure that you also have a Government issued picture ID with you before leaving the ship, as you may be required to show this at security checkpoints upon your return. Be aware that we have established a secure area around the vessel and our security procedures require that you must be prepared to show your ship's identity card when entering this area, in addition to showing it to the security staff at the gangway when leaving or boarding the ship. We kindly ask you not to accept and bring on board any parcels or packages for strangers. Before boarding the ship, you may be asked by our security staff to open parcels or handbags which you are carrying. We are sure that you will appreciate that this security is in the best interests of all concerned.

SPECIAL NOTICE

QUEEN ELIZABETH, as with most modern ships, has a vacuum operated toilet system. The pipe work of this system is much smaller than that used ashore. Whilst it is eminently suitable for its designed purpose, sanitary items, paper hand towels and items that are not rapidly biodegradable will cause obstructions. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Whilst in US waters the drinking age on board QUEEN ELIZABETH is 21 years of age. Guests under 21 years will not be served alcoholic beverages nor are they to consume them. Please be aware that proof of age by means of government issued photographic identification, may be requested. Guests under the age of 18 years are also not permitted in the Yacht Club after 12.00am.

MEDICAL SERVICES

The Medical Centre is open twice a day for routine, non-emergency consultations with the Ship's Doctor. These opening hours can be found in the Daily Programme. For emergencies only, please press the speed dial button marked 'emergency' on your telephone or dial 999 or 911. Tablets for sea sickness are available from the Purser's Desk.

SMOKING ON BOARD QUEEN ELIZABETH

Please be advised that all public spaces on board are no smoking except within clearly defined smoking areas. These include:

- outside Decks 3 and 10 (starboard side)
- Churchill's Cigar Lounge, Deck 10 (cigar smoking only)

Smoking is not permitted in any alleyways nor inside or outside lifts. We also kindly ask guests to be mindful of ash and butts falling onto stateroom balconies when smoking outside.

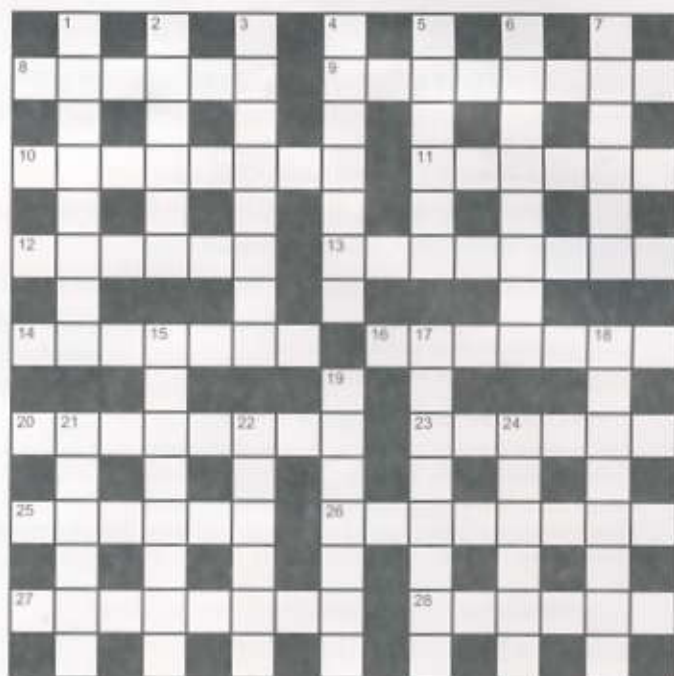
USE OF LIFTS
